"LEST" in HEBREWS

In the KJV, our English word "lest" is used to translate 3 different Greek words:

- 1) με ("MAY") = "NOT!", "no", "lest"; 2) **ινα με** ("HINA MAY") = "that not", "so that not", "lest";
- & 3) **μεποτε** ("MAY-POTAY") = "lest at any time", "perhaps", "whether or not", "lest haply", "lest". They are used to define a command and warning in each of the major judgement passages in Hebrews. They also reveal the progression of a downward spiral away from God and toward greater consequences.
